We are very grateful for Alex Araujo's term in the executive board. Alex has been a very good challenge to us in AVM since we first met in the Seattle conference at the start of 2009. He has agreed to continue to serve on the advisory board, but has resigned his position on the executive board. I hope to have a new name for the exec. board to announce by the end of January 2011.

- Elizabeth Parson's article comes out in support of the AVM position on language by pointing to different understandings of English by Zambian miners as against their European bosses. The differences in understanding render the running of mines extremely problematic, she tells us. Elizabeth also advocates that social science disciplines and theology need to be considered in the planning and designing of development in Africa: Parsons, Elizabeth C., 2008. 'Insights from Zambian miners for rethinking development policy and the environment.' *Development in Practice*, Volume 18, Number 3, June 2008, 403-411.
- AVM is in some senses an imitation of the practice by anthropologists known as 'participant observation'. This puts us in an alliance with the discipline of anthropology. In many ways, anthropology has long been known to be foundationally opposed to theology. This apparent incompatibility between anthropology and theology is in more recent years being reviewed.
